Note: “In the entire Book of Esther, the name of God is not mentioned one time”-so say the scholars. [BUT THEY NEVER TELL US WHY?! By the way, the Devil's name isn't mentioned either, but he, like God, is clearly present. I wonder why the scholars failed to mention that!]

While the Book of RUTH mentions “God” and “The Lord” repeatedly, His name is notably missing in ESTHER'S Book. *Why-you ask-did The Lord forget to leave His calling card in a book He had written? MAYBE, HE DIDN'T FORGET!* Might there be a *simple* explanation to this question? I say “Yes”, and the answer is found the moment we focus our attention on King Ahasuerus. IN TYPE, this King *mirrors* The King of Heaven. (This subject will be given *full* analysis; in chapter one of this book.) If that's the case, here's the conclusion: God *is* mentioned in Esther's Book; in the *person* of King Ahasuerus. Should a SECOND Royal King be introduced, when one is ALREADY representing Him; wouldn't the *SECOND* picture, of *the SAME CHARACTER, in the SAME story*, be *redundant*? For that reason, only ONE *type* (or *picture*) appears in this story for each of the following characters:

King Ahasuerus-presented as The Most High King

Mordecai-presented as The Lord Jesus Christ

Esther-presented as God's Wife-Israel

Vashti-presented as The Flesh

Haman-presented as The Devil

And...

Haman's Wife-presented as The Devil's Wife-Revelation 17
